



Greenhills Camp Health and Safety Policy

At Greenhills Camp, the health and safety of our campers and staff is our top priority. We are committed to providing a safe and healthy environment for everyone at camp. Our health and safety policy includes the following measures:

1. **Staff Training:** All our staff members receive extensive training on emergency procedures, child protection, and other relevant topics to ensure they are well-equipped to handle any situation that may arise.
2. **Camper Health:** All campers are required to submit health information and emergency contact information when registering. This information is kept confidential and shared with staff members on a need-to-know basis. It is up to the parent or guardian to provide us with information if the child is feeling unwell before camp commences. For the safety of the other children and staff on campus, please do not send any child who is feeling unwell to camp.
3. **First Aid and Medical Care:** Nikki is trained in basic first aid and CPR, and we have a fully stocked first aid kit on-site. In case of an

emergency, we have a protocol to transport campers to the nearest hospital or medical facility.

4. **Safety and Security:** We take appropriate measures to ensure the safety and security of our campers and staff, including proper supervision, clear communication protocols, and strict guidelines on visitors. Please note that parents are not permitted to walk around the campus during camp times. They must phone Colm and wait in the carpark area in Greenhills.
5. **Hygiene:** We promote good hygiene practices, including regular hand washing and proper cleaning and sanitisation of camp facilities and equipment.
6. **Emergency Preparedness:** We have an emergency response plan in place and conduct regular drills to ensure that all staff members are prepared to handle emergencies.

We believe that by implementing these measures, we can create a safe and healthy environment for all our campers and staff. Our health and safety policy is designed to ensure that everyone has a positive and enjoyable camp experience.
